Dear Parents,

Homework folders were sent home today. **It is your child's responsibility to print his/her first name on the TOP of each sheet of homework in pencil!** Please let your students write his/her own name. This is the only way they are going to learn! PLEASE do not re-staple the homework pages together. Do not send a little each day. Keep the folders at home until everything is completed and then return with your completed book report on Friday. Homework MUST be back on Friday to get full credit for assignments.

Several parents have sent notes and or hot lunch money via their student's book bag/back pack. Please when you do this put EVERYTHING in the biggest pocket of the book bag/back pack. Some of the bags have so many pockets that we don't have time to search through all the pockets every morning. We open the main/largest pocket and take out all the correspondence from home every morning. Please help by using the main or largest pocket!

This is "**Blue Week**", in Kindergarten. Many of our activities this week will revolve around the color **blue**. Tomorrow, (Tuesday) each student is asked to bring **TWO** disposable items for our "**Blue Chart**". These items will be taped to our blue tag

board chart. These can be anything from pictures the student cuts out to napkins, straws, balloons, etc. (Light enough to tape on the chart....Please no more than 2 per student).

Just a reminder:

- We will be asking for a donation of a box of graham crackers and straws, from each student. We will notify you when it is your turn.
- Please remember we are a **PEANUT FREE SCHOOL**.
- Please practice with your child on how to tuck in their shirt. Shirts must be tucked in at all times. Many of the students are coming back from the bathroom with their shirts untucked. If you have any questions about the dress code, please refer to the school web site.
- Please talk to your student about keeping their hands and feet to themselves.
- Also, please remind your student to respect other people's privacy in the bathroom. (There are students that are looking under bathroom stalls).
- Share day colors are as follows: Monday is blue table; Tuesday is green table; Thursday is red table; and Friday is yellow table.
- Continue to practice the Sign of the Cross and prayers.

Here is a small overview of what we will be doing this week:

This week's objective in religion is to discover God's overflowing love. All of nature-woods, rocks, water, wind-reveals God's grandeur and boundless generosity, God's deep desire to share.

Our math objective this week is to continue working in Math Chapter 1. We are using strategies to count, read, and write numbers 0 to 5.

Language Arts introduces the story We Are So Proud. Students will be introduced the letters and sounds of Ff, Gg, Hh, Ii, Jj, Kk, Ll, Mm, Nn. We will also be learning about settings, syllables, following directions, and writing.

Science this week revolves around Energy and Force. How does something move?

## Homework

1. Practice the sign of the cross and prayers.
2. Bring TWO disposable Blue items for the Blue Chart... due Tuesday
3. Color page...Use crayons to color the blue items, blue. You may use other colors where needed (EXP. Flowers, plate, clouds, etc.)
4. Blue Bird Page... Trace the color words *blue* in pencil. Use a pencil. Color the crayons blue. Use crayons. Circle all the words that spell blue with a pencil. Color the bluebird blue.

**Special Note: When the directions call for blue be sure to use the color Blue and not a variation of blue, like blue green, indigo, blue violet, etc. The student must be able to find the crayon that reads blue!**

5. Handwriting... Complete one page of capital and lowercase letters. Take your time and work on the correct formation of the letters. Use a pencil. Practice writing their name.
6. Math... Complete 2 math pages...Directions are found on the page. Use a pencil unless otherwise directed. Then use crayons, if asked.
7. Book Report...pick a book from home. Read the book to your child or, if your child can read, have them read the book to you. **Your child MUST write down the information their self!** You may guide the student. Ask your child about the book (one sentence is okay). Write down the information on a separate piece of paper for your child and then have your

child write it on the “A Whale of a Tale” sheet. If your child is having a difficult time writing, you use a yellow highlighter and write on the “A Whale of a Tale” sheet and then have your child trace the letters.

8. All homework folders and book report due Friday. **Please remove the staple from the homework do not re-staple homework. Also please make sure your child’s name is on each paper.**
9. Wednesday, September 13<sup>th</sup> is Liturgy. **Please no shorts on Wednesday.** Girls may wear white polo shirt with emblem with their skirt. They must still wear the white blouse with the Peter-Pan collar when they wear their jumpers.
10. The Paper Doll Project is due Friday, September 15<sup>th</sup>.
