



St Edward Jr High Objectives

October 24th – November 4th

8th Grade

Science: We are beginning to understand and analyze the Periodic Table. Students should be looking up possible topics for Science Fair. This is not mandatory but suggested.

Literature: Our focus is on Short stories and vocabulary. Students are also learning new vocabulary. Students are completing a mosaic with construction paper.

Algebra: Chapter 4: Students will graph and solve inequalities, including compound inequalities, and build on and compare methods used to those used in solving equations.

** Chapter 4 Test-Wednesday, November 2nd

Art: Unit 3: Students will identify a variety of art media and techniques used to create artworks. They will relate art to personal experiences and respond to and make judgments about artworks.

**Vocabulary Quiz: Thursday, November 3rd

Spelling/Vocab: *Group 1 will take the Unit 5 test on Tuesday, October 25. They will begin Unit 6 with the words expedition, log, perspective, route, mishap, discrimination, episode, visible, overtake, and recover. The Unit 6 WB pages will be due Tuesday, November 1. On November 1, group 1 will do the Units 4-6 review. *Group 2 will miss some days for the retreat so they will not take the Unit 5 test until Thursday, November 3. They will then begin Unit 6 AND the Units 4-6 review lessons.

Pre-Algebra (Grier): Students will continue working on Ch 3 solving equations with decimals and learning the Metric System. Ch 3 Test— Wed., Nov. 2nd.

Art: Unit 5: Students will identify subjects and styles in artwork. They will relate art to personal experiences and respond to and make judgments about artworks. **Vocabulary Quiz: Tuesday, November 1st

Spelling/Vocab: The students will turn in their completed Unit 4 WB pages and take their test the week of October 24. They will begin Unit 5 with the words - illustrate, gain, manipulate, consumers, purchase, immune, generalization, manual, lend, and manuscript. This work will be due the week of October 31. They will then begin Unit 6 with the words - commitment, dynamic, vocal, confirm, violate, slander, register, valid, elect, and pitfall.
